

1880 A 3VOD with number 404 was issued and sent to Belvedere on 20<sup>th</sup>Mar1880, was only used in the post 1883 Belvedere SO. see below:

1883 Belvedere(404) changed its name to Picardy(412) and Lessness Heath(412) changed its name to Belvedere SO(404).

# BELVEDERE S.O(EX.LESSNESS HEATH) ... ... PROVINCIAL AREA 1883 – 1907.

1883 Lessness Heath(412) changed its name to Belvedere SO(404).

1883 - 1901 Belvedere SO was an Independent Sub Office.

**404 3VOD** is now used in the new Belvedere SO, it was issued to the old "Belvedere" on the 20<sup>th</sup>Mar1880. Only used in the new "Belvedere SO" from the 21<sup>st</sup>Oct1884 to 15<sup>th</sup>Aug1891. Rarity G.



1901 – 1907 A Receiving House of Belvedere Station.

1907 Belvedere SO was renamed Bexley Road. Belvedere Station was renamed Belvedere SO and this occurs in the 1924 to 1962 Lists with the number 201.

1875 – 1876 A Suburban District Office with the comment that "District initials should be omitted from the address" ie in the London District but used Provincial style cancellations.

1877 – 1879 A Suburban District as above, but now in the Woolwich District

1875 Number 389 3VOS in Provincial style was issued, it was used first whilst Bexley was in the South Eastern District and then when in the Kent Provincial Area.

In the c.1860 Ride with Rotherhithe 21B, Deptford 18, Greenwich 20, **Charlton 12B**, Woolwich 21, Plumstead 20B, Welling 22B, Bexley 23, Lessness Heath 16B and Erith 14B. Offices that were Suburban Sorting Offices at this time that did not have numbers, were given them. Charlton was allocated **12B**.

1857 – 1858 The Suburban District of Charlton had just one Receiving House called Old Charlton 1859 – 1868 Charlton Suburban District had its main Receiving House at New Charlton.

Issued 15<sup>th</sup>May1861. Not seen used on cover. Cover: rarity H\*. Stamps: rarity G, price on perf £30.



1869 – 1874 Charlton Suburban District had its main Receiving House at Old Charlton.
1875 – 1876 As above; but with the comment "District Initials should no longer be used in the address".
This signifies that Charlton was now in the London District but used Provincial style cancellations.

#### 379 3VOS.

Sent to Old Charlton. Two were issued on 24<sup>th</sup>Apr1875. Used 10<sup>th</sup>Nov1875 to 12<sup>th</sup>Sep1879. Rarity F. Price £30.



1877-1879 As above; but now in the Woolwich District.

1879 Number 379 3VOD Issued in Mar1879 with Charlton in the cds, as there was no such office, it was rarely used. In Aug 1879 one was issued with Old Charlton in the cds, both were used later whilst Charlton was solely in the Kent Provincial Area





Charlton in error – rarely used.

Correct name Old Charlton issued five months later

1879 Woolwich District moved to the Kent Provincial Area taking with it; Plumstead, Bexley, Charlton, Erith, Lessness Heath, Shooters Hill and Welling.

# PROVINCIAL AREA 1879 - 1913

An office just called Charlton did not exist during the period 1876 to 1902 when provincial style cancellations were used. Charlton was the name solely used for a Suburban District, that comprised several Receiving Houses including Old Charlton and New Charlton. In 1902 (the last year barred numerals were used) the Church Lane, Old Charlton Office was renamed Charlton BO. This Office was allocated the number 21 in the 1924 to 1962 Lists of London Numbers.

1879 – 1902 Old Charlton was an Independent Sub Office with subordinate offices at New Charlton, Lower Road and Woolwich Road.

1902 – 1913 A Town Receiving House of the new Charlton Branch Office which was previously the Church Lane Old Charlton Office.

1913 – Transferred back to London. 21 allocated in the London Lists from 1924 to 1962.
