NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR CONSENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 88

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991 that an application has been made to the Environment Agency by Dwr Cymru for consent to discharge a rainfall dependent volume of storm sewage for flows in excess of 1020 litres per second to Upper Clydach River at National Grid Reference SN 72172 03939 from a storm sewage overflow located at Dilwyn Arms CSO, Herbert Street, Pontardawe.

Flows of up to 1 in 5 year flow will be screened prior to discharge.

Any person who wishes to make representations about the application should do so in writing to The Environment Agency, Water Quality Permitting Support Centre, PO Box 4209, Sheffield, S9 9BS, during the period 16/1/09 to 27/2/09 quoting reference BP0343601.

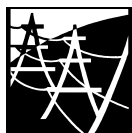

Notice of application for consent to construct and operate a wind farm on a site known as Carnedd Wen, north of Llanbrynmair, Montgomeryshire, Powys, Mid Wales.

Notice is hereby given that Npower Renewables Ltd (the Company) has applied under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989, for consent of the Secretary of State for Energy and Climate Change to construct and operate a wind farm OF UP TO 250 megawatts on land to the south of the A458, and north of Llanbrynmair (Llanbrynmair Forest) in Montgomeryshire, Powys.

Npower Renewables Ltd has also applied for the Secretary of State to direct that planning permission for these works shall be deemed to be granted under Section 90(2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, as provided for in paragraph 7(1) of Schedule 8 to the Electricity Act 1989. An environmental statement has been prepared under the Electricity Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000.

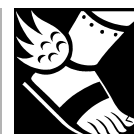
Any objections, letters of support or other representations to the Carnedd Wen wind farm and habitat management proposals, should

be made in writing to; the Secretary of State for Energy & Climate Change, c/o Bay 2123, 1 Victoria Street, London SW1H 0ET, or by email to:- gareth.leigh@berr.gsi.gov.uk not later than Friday 13th February 2009. Unless otherwise indicated, copies of any objections, and other representations received, will be regarded as public documents.

During the consideration of the proposal the Secretary of State may formally request further information from the developer to supplement the Environmental Statement, and materially relevant additional information may also be generated. If that happens further public notices will give advice on how representations may be made to the Secretary of State on this material.

Following receipt of all views and representations the Secretary of State will either grant or refuse consent for the proposal (with or without conditions). This may involve holding a public inquiry first, depending on whether there is a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or the Secretary of State decides to exercise his discretion to call a public inquiry in the light of objection by other persons. Royal Mail Group Limited^(a) by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 89 of the Postal Services Act 2000^(b) and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on 19th January 2009 and may be cited as the Royal Mail Group Limited Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No.13) Scheme 2009.

2. This Scheme shall be read as one with the Successor Postal Services Company Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 2001^(c) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), as amended by the Consignia plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 1) Scheme 2001^(d), the Consignia plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 2) Scheme 2001^(e), the Consignia plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 3) Scheme 2002^(f), the Consignia plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 4) Scheme 2002^(g), the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 5) Scheme 2003^(h), the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 6) 2003⁽ⁱ⁾, the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 7) 2003^(j), the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 8) 2004^(k), the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 9) 2005^(l) and the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 10) 2006^(m) and the Royal Mail Group Ltd Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 11) 2007⁽ⁿ⁾ and the Royal Mail Group Ltd Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 12) 2008^(o) and the Royal Mail Group Ltd Overseas Parcel Post (Amendment No. 13) 2009^(p) and the Royal Mail Group Ltd Overseas Parcel Post

ROYAL COMMISSION INVITES COMMENTS ON TOPICS FOR FUTURE STUDY

The Royal Commission on Environmental Pollution today invited comments on a short list of topics being considered for its next major study.

The proposed topics, in alphabetical order, are:

- Deciding environmental priorities
- Environmental impact of demographic change
- Human rights and the environment
- Medical and veterinary chemicals in the environment
- Multi-level governance and the environment
- New technologies for waste management

The Chair of the Royal Commission, Sir John Lawton, said today: "We are very keen to hear which of these topics people think would be the most suitable subject for the Commission to investigate now. If there are any other topics that would benefit from our attention, we would like to hear about them too. We will consider all the comments and suggestions we receive to help us decide which topic we should look at."

The Royal Commission welcomes views from anyone who wishes to contribute. The deadline for responses is Friday 13 February 2009.
