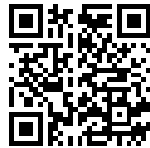

EARLY POSTING.

LETTERS SHOULD BE POSTED AS EARLY IN THE DAY as possible. In many rural districts there is only one delivery, and letters for such districts, unless posted in time for early evening mails, cannot be delivered until the second day after posting.

DELIVERY OF TELEGRAMS.

The attention of senders and addressees of telegrams is drawn to the arrangements described at pages 88 and 89 of the July Guide for the delivery of telegrams by telephone.

IMPERIAL CABLE.

A State-owned cable is now working to Canada. Telegrams for Canada, British West Indies or Australasia may be sent by this route ("VIA IMPERIAL") if handed in at a Post Office. For rates, see pages 766, 764 and 743 of the July Guide.

INLAND POST.

(Page 13.)

NEWSPAPERS.

Delete the first paragraph and substitute the following:—

The prepaid rate of postage on copies of publications registered for transmission at the Inland Newspaper Rate, including any supplements thereto, is one penny for every copy not exceeding 6 oz. in weight, with a further charge of one halfpenny for every additional 6 oz. or fraction of 6 oz.

FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST.

(Page 52.)

LETTERS.

The last sentence of the first paragraph should be amended to read: "To H.M. Ships of War and H.M. Troops serving abroad the letter rate is 2d. for the first ounce and 1d. for each succeeding ounce (see page 83)."

(Page 73.)

INSURANCE.

Boxes.

First paragraph. *Insert "Austria" before "Belgium" in the list of Countries participating in the Insured Box Service.*

AIR MAIL SERVICE BETWEEN LONDON AND (Page 78.) PARIS.

Delete the entire paragraph, and substitute:

AIR MAIL SERVICES.

A leaflet containing information concerning the Air Mail Services can be obtained on application at any Head Post Office.

CASH ON DELIVERY SERVICE.

(Page 81.)

The third sentence of the first paragraph should be amended to read: "The Trade Charge on any one parcel may in no case exceed £40; and the amount of the Trade Charge may not be cancelled or reduced after the parcel is posted."

(Page 82.)

The reference to page 740 in the fourth paragraph should be amended to 739.

INLAND TELEGRAMS.

(Page 85.)

Cancel the first paragraph, and substitute the following:—

The charge is 1s. for the first 12 words, including the address, and 1d. for every additional word. Telegrams handed in on Sundays, Good Friday and Christmas Day will be charged 6d. extra.

(Page 87.)

Telegram Forms and Mode of Payment.*Cancel* the second paragraph, and *substitute* the following:—

Forms with embossed stamps can be obtained singly; or, in books of 20, interleaved and with a sheet of carbonic paper, price 20s. 8d.

(Page 87.)

Mode of Delivery and Porterage Charges.*Cancel* the second paragraph, and *substitute* the following:—

When the address is beyond the limit of free delivery, porterage is charged at the rate of 6d. a mile or part of a mile, the distance being calculated from the limit of free delivery.

(Pages 88 and 89).

Prepayment of Replies.*Add a paragraph as follows:—*

Reply telegrams handed in on Sundays, Good Friday and Christmas Day will be charged 6d. extra, unless this amount has been prepaid by the sender of the original telegram, in which event the reply form will be marked on the back "Sunday Rate Prepaid."

(Page 90.)

Registered Abbreviated Addresses.*Cancel* the first sentence, and *substitute* the following:—

Any person may register an abbreviated or arbitrary address on payment of a registration fee of £2 a year, dating from the day of registration.

Cancel second paragraph. *Substitute* the following:

Special instructions relating to the delivery of telegrams bearing a registered address can be given on payment of 5s. for each separate instruction. The fees for officially recording a change of address are 1s. for a record for one week, 2s. 6d. for a month, and £1 1s. for a year, but the record may be cancelled and the original address resumed without further charge.

Third paragraph. *Amend* second sentence to read:—

"In London the indicator 'Phone' denotes telephonic delivery from the Central Telegraph Office, and registrants, after notifying the Controller, Central Telegraph Office, should substitute," etc.

Multiple Address Telegrams.

Cancel the first sentence, and *substitute* the following :—

A telegram will be delivered at two or more addresses in the same free delivery on prepayment of the ordinary telegram charges for the total number of words in the addresses and text in addition to a charge of fourpence for every copy beyond the first.

(Page 91.) Repetition of Telegrams.

Delete " a fraction of a halfpenny being reckoned as a halfpenny " from the first paragraph.

Cancel the second paragraph, and *substitute* the following :—

If the receiver of a telegram doubts its accuracy he may have it repeated by paying half the amount paid for its transmission to him. Should he require only a portion of the message to be repeated, a payment must be made at the half rate sufficient to cover the number of words to be repeated. For example, if 20 words in a message of 40 words are to be repeated the payment would be 10*d.* The minimum charge, however, for repetition (even of a single word) is 6*d.* The money will be refunded if it should turn out that the original telegram was incorrectly transmitted.

(Page 91.) Re-direction.

Cancel the first paragraph, and *substitute* the following :—

Telegrams can be redirected to a second address either by an Officer of the Post Office or by an agent of the addressee. The charges for officially recording instructions to re-direct telegrams are 1*s.* for a record of one week, 2*s.* 6*d.* for a month, and £1 1*s.* for a year. When official re-direction of telegrams is required, a notice to that effect must be given and the appropriate fee paid in advance; printed forms can be obtained from the local Postmaster. If telegrams bearing a registered address are to be re-directed as well as fully addressed telegrams an additional fee of 1*s.*, whether the removal is temporary or permanent, must be paid. The person making the request is responsible for any charges that may be incurred. Re-directed telegrams are liable, if any additional service is performed, to an additional charge of 1*s.* if the two addresses are within the same town; but if the addresses are in different towns the full inland rate is charged for the re-direction of fully addressed telegrams. Each London Postal District, for example, the whole district called "South Western" is considered for this purpose as a separate town. Telegrams re-directed on Sundays, Good Friday, or Christmas Day will be charged 6*d.* extra.

Cancel the first four lines of the fourth paragraph, and *substitute* the following :—

Should the sender, upon being informed that his telegram cannot be delivered because the addressee is unknown, require the telegram to be presented a second time at the same address, or redirected to another address in the same town, he must pay a further fee of 1*s.*

(Page 92).

Messages telegraphed for Inclusion in Outgoing Mails.

Cancel penultimate sentence, and *substitute* the following:—

Thus, a telegram of 24 words to be sent by post from Liverpool to New York should be prepaid 2s. 3d., viz., 2s. 1d. for the telegram (including 1d. for the name of Liverpool) and 2d. for postage.

Cancelling Telegrams.

Cancel the first four lines as far as "returned," and *substitute* the following:—

The sender may have his telegram cancelled, and if it be cancelled before the commencement of transmission the sum paid will be returned at the time, less a fee of 4d. for cancelling it; but if transmission has commenced, the sum will not be returned.

(Page 94). Night Telegraph Letter Service.

Cancel the last sentence of the first paragraph, and *substitute* the following:—

The rate is 1s. for 86 words or less, and 1d. for every 3 words beyond 86.

(Page 99.)

FOREIGN AND COLONIAL TELEGRAMS:
Repetition at Request of Addressee to Detect
Errors.

Cancel the third paragraph, and *substitute* the following:—

The addressee of a telegram may have it repeated from the first Post Office in the United Kingdom at which it was dealt with on depositing the ordinary charge for the transmission of an inland telegram of the same number of words. If there has been an error the amount deposited for the repetition will be refunded.

Charges returned.

Amend the fourth paragraph to read:—

The amount paid for a telegram cancelled before transmission, less 4d. If a telegram is cancelled after transmission to the next office has been completed, but before it has reached the place to which it is addressed, any balance of charges due will be returned.

(Page 103.)

RADIOTELEGRAMS.

Charges (1).—*Cancel.* *Substitute* the following:—

Charges.—(1.) For Radiotelegrams for transmission through coast stations in the United Kingdom (except Faldhu.—As regards this station see paragraph headed Long-Distance Communication).—The usual inclusive charge for a radiotelegram, whether a ship service or a private message, sent through a coast station in the United Kingdom to ships of most nationalities, including British, is 11d. a word, but for radiotelegrams to ships of Argentine, Belgian, Dutch, German, Greek, Norwegian and Portuguese nationality the charges are as follows, viz.:—7d. a word for the coast station and inland telegraph charge, plus 4d. a word with a minimum of 3s. 4d. a radiotelegram for the ship charge.

Reduced charges are, however, applicable in the case of the Cross-Channel and other short-voyage ships.—See table at pages 775-780.

(Page 104.) **Long-Distance Communication.**

Cancel first paragraph, and *substitute* the following:—

Long-Distance Communication.—There is a special long-distance service with certain ocean liners through a Government station at a total charge of 11d. a word. Particulars of this service can be obtained on application at any Telegraph Office.

The following addition should be made to the section headed "Information regarding Position of Ships":—

The charge for a reply telegram of 12 words must be prepaid. Every effort will be made to keep the reply as short as possible, but if it contains more than 12 words, the excess will be collected on delivery.

(Page 113). **Limit of Amount and Charges.**

Cancel (2), and substitute the following:—

A charge for the Official Telegram of Advice to the office of payment at the ordinary rate for Inland Telegrams, the minimum being 1s.

Particulars shown against an entry in the subjoined list of Amendments supersede those appearing against the corresponding entry in the list given at pages 149 to 509 of the July issue of the Post Office Guide. The list includes the names of the Offices at which the hours of Telegraph business have been changed since the July Guide went to press. The arrangement of the list is as stated on pages 146-148 of the July issue.

Offices which have been opened or closed since the July Guide was printed are denoted by the words "New Office" or "Office closed" in the third column of this list.

Exceptional hours for Telegraph business are indicated in the third column.

Offices open on Sunday evenings are also open on Bank Holidays during the same hours, unless otherwise indicated.

Letters: blank or partly blank invoice forms capable of being filled up and used as genuine invoices; electric and magnetic belts and certain other similar articles; opium, except under prescribed conditions; hop extracts and similar preparations; essence of lager beer; essences of whisky, rum, brandy, cognac and oil of cognac; horns and hoofs; human hair, unless cleansed and dressed or made up for sale; plumage and skins of certain birds, unless for scientific or educational purposes; tobacco, cigars, cigarettes and snuff, unless bona-fide samples or for the personal use of the addressee, who must satisfy the Commonwealth Customs authorities as to the facts; goods bearing the word "Anzac" (or similar word); hypnotic and gazing crystals and similar articles; goods manufactured or produced in, or brought directly or indirectly from Germany, Austria, Hungary, Turkey or Bulgaria, and goods of which more than 5 per cent. of the value is due to the labour and/or material of the countries mentioned; brushes and toilet articles containing or made from the hair of animals if manufactured in certain Eastern Countries.

Apples, pears and quinces are prohibited from importation into Western Australia. There are also prohibitions and restrictions applying to the Commonwealth generally affecting the importation of vines, fruits and plants, potatoes, spirits, vaccine or lymph, hides, skins, wool, hair, bones and other goods, of which particulars can be obtained from the Official Secretary, Commonwealth of Australia, Australia House, Strand, W.C. 2.

Powdered strychnine, arsenic, sodium arsenite, morphia and cocaine are admitted only if sent by registered letter post and specially packed and bearing the word "Poison," and the name and address of the sender.

BELGIUM. Col. 1. Insert the sign † before "Belgium."

Col. 8. After the entry relating to Prohibitions insert:—

"The importation into Belgium of parcels containing wheat or rye, in the form of grain or flour, or sugar, except molasses, is subject to the production of licences issued by the Belgian Département des Affaires économiques."

(Pages 670 and 671.)

BRAZIL. Col. 1. Delete present entry and substitute:—" [Places in the States of Rio de Janeiro, São Paulo, Bahia, Pernambuco, Pará, Minas Geraes, Paraná, and Amazonas only (see column 8)]."

Col. 8. Observations. Delete present entry and substitute:—" Parcels addressed to a Poste Restante are not admitted. The Parcel Post extends only to the States shown in Column 1. Parcels for places in those States other than the cities of Rio de Janeiro, São Paulo, Bahia, Pernambuco, Pará, Bello Horizonte (Minas Geraes), Curitiba (Paraná), and Manaus (Amazonas) must be claimed by the addressees at the Post Offices of those cities, and must bear in the address the words: 'Gare de Rio de Janeiro,' 'Gare de São Paulo,' etc., according to the State in which the place of destination is situated. Parcels must be sealed with a distinctive seal."

(Pages 674 and 675.)

CHILE. Col. 8. Observations. *Delete the last paragraph and substitute:—*

"Invoices certified by a Chilean Consul are required for parcels addressed to Chile, whatever the value of the contents. The Invoices must be enclosed in the parcels, the Customs Declarations being noted accordingly. One Consular Invoice is sufficient for several parcels posted at the same time by one sender to the same addressee. In such cases the parcels should be noted 1, 2, 3, etc., by the sender; and the Invoice should be enclosed in Parcel No. 1, the Customs Declarations of that parcel being noted accordingly. The Customs Declarations or covers of the remaining parcels should be marked 'Consular Invoice in Parcel No. 1.'"

CHINA. (A) Chinese Post Offices *via* Suaz. Col. 8. Observations. *Add at end of paragraph:—*

"Parcels for the Province of Yunnan must be strongly packed in stout cloth or in strong wooden boxes."

Amend the note in italics to read:—"The parcel service to places in the Province of Szechwan, west of Chungking, is temporarily suspended; and parcels for other places in the Province cannot be insured beyond Ichang."

The undermentioned articles may be imported only under permit issued by the competent authority and the permit should accompany the parcel concerned:—salt; tobacco and its products; arms and parts thereof (except prohibited arms); prepared medicines and cosmetics unless addressed to chemists; poisons, poisonous drugs, and preparations declared as harmful to the health by the competent authorities; white paint; dried fruits artificially coloured; toys coated with injurious paint; artificial flowers, tapestries or textures treated with arsenical colour; fresh and preserved meat originating in an extra-European country; saccharine and similar substances; celluloid and articles of celluloid.

Observations. A licence is at present required for the importation into Czecho-Slovakia of practically all articles sent by Parcel Post. Application for such licences should be made to the Office of Foreign Commerce, Prague.

Parcels cannot at present be accepted for Teschen and neighbourhood.

At the end of the last paragraph add: "Parcels for Alsace and Lorraine are normally delivered by the Post Office; and any parcels intended to be called for should be addressed to a Poste Restante."

Col. 8. *Cancel the whole entry and substitute: Prohibitions: Letters; saccharine and similar products, and preparations containing them; loose playing cards and incomplete packs of cards; parts of the vine (except grapes); earth compost; mushroom spawn; potatoes of American origin; fresh fruit infected with the San José insect and plants of American, Australian, or Japanese origin (except water plants); meat (except game and warm-blooded water animals if in sound condition), whether fresh (frozen, dried, smoked, pickled in vinegar) or prepared with chemical preservatives or colouring matter, or in sealed cases; swine's flesh of American origin, in any form (unless accompanied by a proper sanitary certificate); sausages and mixtures of minced meat; salt meat in pieces weighing less than 4 kilos (8 lb. 13 oz.); the nests and eggs of certain birds (but not the eggs of gulls and plovers); birds of various kinds, except poultry and game birds (subject to German Game Laws).*

Parcels containing living plants (including growing bulbs which have developed roots) must be accompanied by a statement made by the sender that he undertakes to bear the cost of examination by an expert and authorizes the addressee or someone else in Germany to pay the fee on his behalf. Such parcels must be packed in boxes, baskets or other closed receptacles, but in such a manner that the contents can be easily examined.

The importation of wine and similar beverages is subject to restrictions.

Observations.—A licence is required for the importation into Germany by the Civil Parcel Post of many categories of articles. Such licences are issued by the Imperial Commissary for Export and Import Licences, Tiergartenstrasse 31, Berlin, W. 10, to whom any enquiry or application on the subject should be addressed.

The above prohibitions and observations do not apply to parcels addressed to members of the British Forces in Germany.
