

THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 14) WARRANT, 1911.
DATED NOVEMBER 28, 1911.

1911. No. 1169.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,* and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the recommendation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

Compulsory registration

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903† (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

2. Where a postal packet or the envelope or cover thereof bears any word, phrase, name, label, design, mark or other indication implying in the opinion of the Postmaster-General that such postal packet contains any article having an intrinsic or marketable value, it may be treated as a postal packet subject to compulsory registration and be dealt with as provided by Clause 65 of the Principal Warrant as amended by the Inland Post Amendment (No. 11) Warrant, 1910,‡ and charged with a registration fee of fourpence in accordance with the provisions of the Principal Warrant.

Short title.

3. This Warrant may be cited as the Inland Post Amendment (No. 14) Warrant, 1911.

Commencement.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1911.
