
POST OFFICE.

THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (NO. 20) WARRANT, 1920, DATED
MAY 27, 1920, INCREASING THE RATES OF POSTAGE ON
LETTERS AND PARCELS.

1920. No. 805.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1918,^(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands

There shall be charged and paid on parcels the following rates of postage (that is to say):—</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">On every parcel not exceeding two pounds in weight, ninepence.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">On every parcel exceeding two pounds and not exceeding five pounds, one shilling.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">On every parcel exceeding five pounds and not exceeding eight pounds, one shilling and threepence.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">On every parcel exceeding eight pounds and not exceeding eleven pounds, one shilling and sixpence.</p> | <p>Rates of postage on parcels.</p> |
| <p>5. This Warrant may be cited as the "Inland Post Amendment (No. 20) Warrant, 1920."</p> | <p>Short title</p> |
