

THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 21) WARRANT, 1920, DATED  
MAY 31, 1920, INCREASING THE RATES OF POSTAGE ON  
PRINTED PACKETS.

1920. No. 874.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1918.(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

Repeal.

Printed packets.

Amendment of Regulation 10 of the Amendment (No. 17) Warrant.

Amendment of Regulation 46 of Principal Warrant.

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

2. On and from the date upon which this Warrant comes into operation, Regulation 6 of the Inland Post Amendment (No. 17) Warrant, 1918(c) (hereinafter referred to as "the Amendment (No. 17) Warrant") shall be repealed, and the following Regulation shall have effect:—

There shall be charged and paid on every book packet (in this Warrant referred to as a "printed packet") the following rates of postage, that is to say:—

On every such packet not exceeding one ounce in weight, one halfpenny.

On every such packet exceeding one ounce in weight, but not exceeding two ounces, one penny.

On every such packet exceeding two ounces in weight, for the first two ounces, one penny, and for every two ounces and for any fractional part of two ounces above the first two ounces, or any additional two ounces, one halfpenny.

3. On and from the date upon which this Warrant comes into operation, Regulation 10 of the Amendment (No. 17) Warrant shall be read and take effect as though the words "two pounds" were substituted therein for the words "two ounces."

4. On and from the date upon which this Warrant comes into operation, Regulation 9 of the Amendment (No. 17) Warrant shall be repealed and Regulation 46 of the Principal Warrant (which relates to the return of certain postal packets) shall be read and take effect as though the words "three halfpence" were substituted therein in lieu of the word "halfpenny."

5. This Warrant may be cited as “the Inland Post Amendment (No 21) Warrant, 1920.” Short title.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1920. Commencement.
