

THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (NO. 22) WARRANT, 1920, DATED AUGUST 31, 1920, INCREASING THE RATES OF POSTAGE ON NEWSPAPERS.

1920. No. 1622.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1920,^(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903,^(b) and all warrants amending the same.

Warrant to be read with existing warrants.
Repeal.

2. On and from the date upon which this Warrant comes into operation Regulation 3 of the Inland Post Amendment (No. 17) Warrant, 1918,^(c) shall be repealed.

3. There shall be charged and paid on every newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet of two or more, the following rates of postage (that is to say) :—

Rates of postage on newspapers.

On every newspaper not exceeding six ounces in weight, one penny.

On every newspaper exceeding six ounces, for the first six ounces, one penny, and for every six ounces, and for any fractional part of six ounces, above the first or any additional six ounces, one halfpenny.

4. This Warrant may be cited as the "Inland Post Amendment (No. 22) Warrant, 1920."
