We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

Rates of postage on letters to and from British North Borneo, &c. Short title.

1. This warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898, and all warrants amending the same.

- 2. The Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898, shall apply to letters transmitted to and from British North Borneo, Jamaica, Labuan, and Mauritius, as if those places respectively were specified in the Second Schedule to the said warrant.
- 3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post (Amendment No. 3) Warrant, 1899."
