THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 13) WARRANT, 1906. DATED MARCH 22, 1906.

1906. No. 231.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898* (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

Application of Principal Warrant to letters to and from Bechuanaland and Rhodesia. Incoming letters not fully paid.

- 2. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, the Principal Warrant shall apply to letters transmitted to and from the Districts known as the Bechuanaland Protectorate and Rhodesia as if those Districts were respectively specified in the Second Schedule to the said Warrant.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Warrant contained, any incoming letter from the Bechuanaland Protectorate or Rhodesia upon which no part, or a part only, of the postage payable thereon is prepaid shall be charged with double the amount of the deficient postage. Provided that such charge shall not exceed 5d. per half ounce.

Short title.

4. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 13) Warrant, 1906."

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the second day of April, One thousand nine hundred and six.
