

FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 2)
WARRANT, 1908. DATED SEPTEMBER 24, 1908.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907* (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants.

2. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant on outgoing letters posted in the United Kingdom for transmission to the United States of America there shall be charged and paid on every such letter the following rates of postage, that is to say :—

Rates of postage on letters to the United States of America.

On every letter not exceeding one ounce in weight one penny.

On every letter exceeding one ounce in weight, for every ounce or fractional part of an ounce one penny.

3. This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1908."

Short title.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1908.
