THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 4) WARRANT, 1908. DATED OCTOBER 16, 1908.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and

under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907* (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.

Extension of Principal Warrant.

2. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, the Principal Warrant shall apply to letters transmitted to and from the British Solomon Islands Protectorate and the Islands within the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner of the Western Pacific as if those Islands were respectively specified in the Second Schedule to the said Warrant.

Short title.

3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 4) Warrant, 1908."

Commencement. 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 20th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and eight.
