THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST (INSURED BOXES)
WARRANT, 1908. DATED DECEMBER 31, 1908.

1908. No. 1313.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with Principal Warrant.

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.

Application of Principal Warrant.

2. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation the provisions of the Principal Warrant, so far as the same are applicable, shall, subject to the provisions hereof, apply to the transmission of insured boxes addressed to a country or place specified in the Schedule hereto, as if such boxes were insured letters transmitted under the Principal Warrant.

Rate of postage on and registration and insurance of insured boxes.

3.—(1.) There shall be charged and paid on every insured box addressed to any country or place specified in the Schedule hereto the rate of postage mentioned against the name of such country or place in the said Schedule.

(2.) Every insured box shall be registered and insured under and in accordance with the provisions of the Principal Warrant.

Special conditions.

4.—(1.) Except by the special permission of the Postmaster-General no insured box shall be forwarded or delivered by post which exceeds 2 lbs. in weight, 12 inches in length, 4 inches in breadth, and 4 inches in depth.

(2.) Without the express permission of the Postmaster-General insured boxes shall not contain:—

- (a.) A letter or anything in the nature of a letter.
- (b.) Current coin (whether current in the British Islands or elsewhere).
- (c.) Bank notes or other bills payable to bearer.

(d.) Securities and articles in the nature of commercial papers.

(e.) Any article or thing not authorised by the customs or other laws or regulations of the British Islands or of the place to which the insured box is addressed or of any country through which it may pass.

(3.) Regulation 41 (3) of the Principal Warrant shall not apply to insured boxes.

5. The provisions of the Warrant, dated the 8th day of June, 1885,* and made by the Commissioners of the Treasury on the recommendation of the Commissioners of Customs and of the Postmaster-General, in relation to the application of the Customs Acts to parcels shall apply to the insured boxes to which this Warrant relates as if the same were parcels.

Application of Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885.

6.—(1.) Any insured box may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address within the British Islands to any country or place to which insured boxes are transmissible under this Warrant, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such insured box the rate of postage and registration and insurance fees payable under this Warrant in respect of the transmission of a like insured box from the British Islands to the country or place to which it may be re-directed.

Redirection.

(2.) No insured box re-directed from a place out of the British Islands to a place within the British Islands or to one of the Agencies of the Postmaster-General mentioned in the Principal Warrant shall be delivered to the addressee except upon payment of all charges for re-direction or otherwise to which the insured box has become liable by the law of the British Islands or of any foreign country or British Possession.

7. In this Warrant the expression "insured box" shall be deemed to include any insured box which is for the time being transmissible under the provisions of the Postal Union Agreement for the exchange of insured letters and boxes of the 26th day of May, 1906, and the detailed Regulations made thereunder.

Definition.

8. This Warrant may be cited as "the Foreign and Colonial Post (Insured Boxes) Warrant, 1908."

Short title.

9. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1909.
