

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 12)  
WARRANT, 1914. DATED DECEMBER 31, 1914.

1915. No. 58.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,<sup>(a)</sup> and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907,<sup>(b)</sup> (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.
2. Clause 5 of the Principal Warrant is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be substituted in lieu thereof, viz. :— Repeal of Clause 5 of Principal Warrant and substitution of new clause.
  5. There shall be charged and paid on every magazine for Canada the following rates of postage, that is to say :—
    - On every packet not exceeding two ounces in weight, one halfpenny.
    - On every packet exceeding two ounces but not exceeding six ounces in weight, one penny.
    - On every packet exceeding six ounces but not exceeding one pound and a half in weight, three halfpence.
    - On every packet exceeding one pound and a half, for every half pound or fractional part of a half pound, one half-penny.
3. This Warrant may be cited as the Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 12) Warrant, 1914. Short title.
4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1915. Commencement.
