

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 1) WARRANT 1922

DATED MAY 27, 1922.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts 1908 to 1920, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners order direct and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1921 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant").
2. In lieu of the rates of postage now payable on British letters and on outgoing letters posted in the United Kingdom for transmission to the United States of America, there shall be charged and paid on every such letter the following rates of postage, that is to say:—
On every letter not exceeding one ounce in weight, three halfpence.
On every letter exceeding one ounce in weight for every ounce or fractional part of an ounce, three halfpence.
3. Where the rate of postage of one halfpenny only has been paid on any printed packet and the packet is posted after such hour as the Postmaster General may from time to time fix, the packet may be detained at the office at which it was posted until the following day, or, if the following day is Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday, until the next following day.
4. Paragraph (i) of Regulation 1 (1) of the Principal Warrant is hereby repealed.
5. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1922."
6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 29th day of May, 1922
