

The British Commonwealth and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 6) Warrant 1952

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by sections two, four, twelve, and eighty-two of the Post Office Act 1908 and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Warrant shall be read as one with the British Commonwealth and Foreign Post Warrant 1948 (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
 - (2) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies to the interpretation of this Warrant as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2.—(1) Regulation forty-six of the principal Warrant (as substituted by regulation five of the British Commonwealth and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant 1949) is hereby revoked, and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—
 - "46. For the registration of outgoing postal packets there shall be charged and paid the following sums, that is to say:—
 - (1) When the packet is registered by delivery to an officer of the Post Office authorised to receive the same, though not on duty at a Post Office, or when the packet is registered at a Post Office before the expiration of the time appointed for the registration at such Post Office (without extra fee) of postal packets intended to be forwarded by the next despatch therefrom, the sum of sixpence (hereinafter called "the registration fee").
 - (2) When the packet is registered at a Post Office after the expiration of the time appointed for the registration at such Post Office (without extra fee) of postal packets intended to be forwarded by the next despatch therefrom, but within such further time (if any) as the Postmaster General may from time to time appoint with reference to such office, such extra sum in addition to the registration fee as may be prescribed. Provided that such sum shall not exceed one shilling and sixpence."
 - (2) Regulation five of the British Commonwealth and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant is hereby revoked.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1952, and may be cited as "The British Commonwealth and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 6) Warrant 1952".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Warrant, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

By this Warrant the registration fee for outgoing postal packets (except parcels) sent to places abroad is increased from fourpence to sixpence.
