TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such warrant; and, from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof; and, from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid; and it is provided, that the power thereby given should extend to any increase or reduction or remission of postage:

And whereas an Act was passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post-office."

And whereas, in consequence of a communication opened with the Post-office of Mecklenburg Schwerin, it is considered expedient to alter the rates of postage payable on letters conveyed by packet boat or private ship between that country and the United Kingdom direct or via Hamburg.

Now we, the undersigned, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such

purpose vested in and by the said recited Acts, or either of them, and of all other powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, direct that on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any part of the Grand Duchy of Mecklenburg Schwerin, and transmitted between any part of the United Kingdom and any place in Mecklenburg Schwerin (conveyed between the United Kingdom and Mecklenburg Schwerin, by packet boat or private ship, direct or via Hamburg), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform rate of British postage of six pence.

And we direct, that on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any part of Mecklenburg Schwerin, transmitted by the post between Mecklenburg Schwerin and any of Her Majesty's Colonies, or any foreign country through the United Kingdom (conveyed by packet boat or private ship between the United Kingdom and Mecklenburg Schwerin, direct or via Hamburg), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform rate of British postage of six pence, for the conveyance of every such letter between Mecklenburg Schwerin and any part of the United Kingdom; and also such a further or additional rate of British postage for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage on letters, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and transmitted direct between such port and such colony or foreign country.

And we further direct, that on every letter, transmitted as is mentioned in this warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged and taken progressive and additional rates of postage, according to the scale of weight and number of rates in the said first recited Act contained as to letters, estimating and charging each additional rate at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this warrant, if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we further direct, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to extend to any letters passing by the post between the United Kingdom and the Duchy of Mecklenburg Schwerin, via France, Belgium, or Holland.

And we further direct, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges granted by the said first recited Act, or by an Act, made and passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the management of the Post-office;" and that all such exemptions and privileges shall remain in full force.

And we further direct, that the terms and expressions used in this warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning, in all respects, as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

And we further direct, that this warrant shall come into operation on the first day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any three of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

Eastern Counties Railway.

(Enlargement of London and Stratford Stations, and Amendment of Acts) Amendment of Act.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for an Act to explain and amend certain of the provisions of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to enable the Eastern Counties Railway Company to enlarge their London and Stratford Stations, and to amend such of the provisions of the Acts relating to the Eastern Counties Railway Company," as authorize the creation of capital by issuing certain shares to be called "Eastern Counties York Extension Shares," and restrict the amount of the capital to be so raised, and to authorize capital to be raised by means of the said shares for the purposes of works; Bills for constructing which were introduced into Parliament in the last session, and are now pending before Parliament by reason and in consequence of certain resolutions of the Houses of Lords and Commons, passed respectively on the tenth day of June last, authorizing the suspension of further proceedings upon Bills for the construction of railways till the next session of Parliament. And it is intended, by such proposed Act, to amend, so far as may be necessary for the purposes thereof, the several Acts of Parliament following, relating to or affecting the Eastern Counties Railway, that is to say, the 6th and 7th William 4th, cap. 106; 1st and 2nd Victoria, cap. 81; 4th Victoria, cap. 14; 7th Victoria, cap. 20; 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 62; 8th and 9th Victoria, caps. 110 and 201; 9th and 10th Victoria, cap. 258; 6th and 7th William 4th, cap. 103; 2nd and 3rd Victoria, caps. 77 and 78; 3rd Victoria, cap. 52; 4th Victoria, cap. 24; 4th and 5th Victoria, cap. 42; 6th Victoria, cap. 28; 7th Victoria, cap. 35; 10th and 11th Victoria, caps. 92, 156, 157, 158, and 235.—Dated this sixth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.
