TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS an Act of Parliament was passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage." And whereas, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power or authority in them for such purpose vested in and by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, did, by a certain Warrant under the hands of two of the said Commissioners, bearing date the 5th day of June, 1855, fix certain rates of postage on letters transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and the colony of Victoria (direct or through any foreign country), and between the colony of Victoria and any other of Her Majesty's colonies or any foreign country through the United Kingdom (whether through any foreign country or not).

And whereas it is expedient that the said Warrant, and the rates of postage therein men-

tioned, should be repealed.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners by the authority of the Statute in that case made and provided), order and direct that the said recited Warrant of the 5th day of June, 1855, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, revoked, and annulled, and that the rates of postage therein mentioned and set forth, shall wholly cease and determine.

And we do further order and direct, that all letters transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and the colony of Victoria (direct or through any other colony, or through any foreign country), and between the colony of Victoria and any other of Her Majesty's colonies, or any foreign country through the United Kingdom (whether through any colony or foreign country or not), shall, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable on such respective letters, be charged and chargeable with the same single and progressive rates of postage, and be under and subject to the same orders, directions, and regulations as such respective letters were liable and subject to under or by virtue of a certain Warrant under the hands of two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 21st day of June, 1854.

And we do hereby further order and direct, that this Warrant shall come into operation on the 7th

day of November, 1855.

And we do hereby further order and direct, that the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage here-by fixed, or any of the orders, regulations, conditions and restrictions hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates, orders, regulations, conditions, and restrictions in lieu thereof, and from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be
