TREASURY WARBANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order and direct as follows :-

1. Any registered newspaper, or packet of registered newspapers, may be sent by post, with or without a supplement or supplements, from any place within the United Kingdom to any of the several places mentioned in the second column of the first schedule hereto, by the routes and means of conveyance described and set forth in the third column of the said schedule, at such rates of postage, for each newspaper, as are specified in the fourth column of the said schedule, subject to the regulations and conditions made and prescribed by a certain Treasury Warrant, dated 27th day of December, 1870.

2. No such newspaper or packet shall be for-warded by post the weight of which shall exceed five pounds, or (unless by special permission of the Postmaster-General), the dimensions of which shall exceed two feet in length, or one foot in breadth or depth.

3. If the postage chargeable under this Warrant, on any newspaper, or packet of newspapers, posted, in the United Kingdom, is not prepaid in conformity with the condition prescribed in that behalf, such newspaper or packet shall (except in the cases hereafter in this clause mentioned), be detained and returned or given up to the sender ; but if the postage chargeable under this Warrant on any such newspaper or packet posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to British India, Hong Kong, Ceylon, or the Straits Settle- hundred and seventy-four.

ments, be so prepaid to the extent of one penny for each newspaper, such newspaper or packet shall be forwarded charged with the deficient postage, and an additional rate of postage, in respect of each newspaper, of one penny.

4. If any registered newspaper, or packet of registered newspapers, is sent by post otherwise than in conformity with the conditions and regulations applicable thereto (except as hereinbefore mentioned), it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

5. The rates of postage fixed by this Warrant on registered newspapers and packets of registered newspapers, transmitted by the post as hereinbefore mentioned, shall be in lieu of those now chargeable thereon.

6. Any British, Colonial, or Foreign Netspaper, or packet of British, Colonial, or Fore gri Newspapers, may be sent by post, with or without a supplement or supplements, from Gibralta er Malta to any of the several places mentioned in the second column of the second schedule heret, by the routes and means of conveyance described and set forth in the third column of the said second schedule, at such rates of postage, for each newspaper (in lieu of the rates now payable), as are specified in the fourth column of the said second schedule, subject to the regulations and conditions of transmission now in force and applicable thereto.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of September, one thousand eight
