TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and

under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. The rates of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General (in lieu of those now payable) in respect of letters conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post, as mentioned and described in the Schedule hereunder written, shall be the rates of postage which are fixed and specified by and in such Schedule.

2. In charging the postage fixed by this Warrant upon an insufficiently prepaid letter, posted in or addressed to the United Kingdom, credit shall be given for any postage already paid.

3. The Treasury Warrant dated the 20th day of December, 1872, is hereby repealed as from the date on which this Warrant comes into operation.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

THE SCHEDULE.
