THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, reporting the prohibition by the Porte of the exportation of horses, mules, and cattle from Crete, and also a Despatch announcing the decision of the Porte to prohibit the export of cereals from the Vilayet of Adrianople.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. So much of the Treasury Warrant, dated the 4th day of August, 1877, as relates to the rates of postage upon letters conveyed by post from the Argentine Republic to the United Kingdom, is hereby repealed.

2. The rate of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in lieu of the rate fixed and specified in the said Warrant in respect of letters posted in the Argentine Republic addressed to the United Kingdom, shall be the rate of postage mentioned and specified in the Schedule hereunder written, which said Schedule is hereby substituted for Part 2 of Schedule No. 1 of the said Warrant, so far as such last-mentioned Schedule relates to such letters as aforesaid.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1877.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

RATES of POSTAGE to be charged and paid in the United Kingdom on Letters posted in the Argentine Republic, addressed to and received in the United Kingdom.

Routes and Means of Conveyance.	On each Letter. For every half an ounce in weight, or for any fractional part of half an ounce over and above the first, or any additional half an ounce.
By any route or means of conveyance	One shilling.
