TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. The Treasury Warrants, dated respectively the 10th day of September, 1878, and the 8th day of January, 1879, relating respectively to the rates of postage upon postal packets and letters conveyed by post to and from Peru are hereby repealed.

2. The rates of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in lieu of the rates fixed and specified in the said Warrant of the 10th day of September, 1878, in respect of postal

packets other than letters conveyed by post to and from Peru, shall be the rates of postage mentioned and specified in the Warrant of the 6th day of December, 1869, so far as such Warrant relates to such postal packets as aforesaid.

3. The rates of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General in lieu of the rates fixed and specified in the said Warrants of the 10th day of September, 1878, and the 8th day of January, 1879, in respect of letters conveyed by post to and from Peru, shall be the rates of postage mentioned and specified in the Warrant of the 4th day of May, 1878, so far as such Warrant relates to such letters as aforesaid.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1879.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. 2. All such postal packets as are hereinbefore referred to shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions applicable thereto respectively, contained in the aforesaid Schedules, and in Schedule No. 4 hereunder written.

3. The Treasury Warrants dated respectively the 23rd day of December, 1875, the 30th day of May, 1876, the 28th day of November, 1876, the 22nd day of March, 1877, the 20th day of April, 1877, the 28th day of April, 1877, the 22nd day of June, 1877, the 4th day of August, 1877, the 26th day of February, 1878, and the 25th day of November, 1878, are hereby respectively repealed as from the date on which this Warrant comes into operation.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

The rate or rates of postage (less the British inland rate or rates) for the time being payable on an unpaid packet of printed papers and pattern or sample packet so posted and of like weight addressed to the United Kingdom in addition to the rate or rates of postage chargeable and payable at the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, Beyrout, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or Tangier respectively under Schedule No. 2 on a packet of printed papers and pattern or sample packet of the same weight posted in either of the last-named places addressed to the United Kingdom.

SCHEDULE No. 5.

REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS, &c., as to the Posting, Forwarding, Conveyance, and Delivery of Postal Packets, conveyed or delivered for conveyance by Post as mentioned and described in the foregoing Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4.

Part I.—General Regulations and Conditions.

1. Any postal packet posted in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or Tangier, or at either of the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, addressed to any country or place mentioned in the first column of Part 1 of Schedule No. 1, or to the United Kingdom, may be registered, provided that all rates of postage and additional sums for registration chargeable thereon be fully prepaid.

2. The sender of any registered postal packet so posted and addressed as aforesaid, may obtain from the addressee of such packet, an acknowledgment of the delivery of such packet to such addressee by paying in advance at the time of posting such packet an additional sum of two pence and one half penny.

3. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to any country or place mentioned in the first column of Part 1 of Schedule No. 1, any postal packet which shall contain either gold or silver money, any jewel or precious article, or any article liable to customs' duties in such countries or places respectively; and any such packet, if posted, shall be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

4. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to any country or place mentioned in the first column of Part 1 of Schedule No. 1, any newspaper, or packet of newspapers, exceeding four pounds in weight, nor any packet of commercial papers or packet of printed papers, exceeding four pounds in weight, nor any pattern or sample packet exceeding one half of a pound in weight; and any such newspaper or packet, if posted, shall be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

5. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post, any pattern or sample packet, the dimensions of which shall exceed eight inches in length, four inches in breadth, and two inches in depth; and any such packet, if posted, shall be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

6. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post, unless by the special permission in any case or class of cases of the Postmaster-General, any postal packet, other than a pattern or sample packet, the dimensions of which shall exceed two feet in length and one foot in breadth or depth; and any such packet, if posted, shall, be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

7. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post any postal packet which shall contain anything which might by pressure or otherwise be rendered injurious either to the Officers of the Post Office or to the contents of the mail bags, nor any packet of commercial papers, packet of printed papers or pattern, or sample packet which shall not be securely packed and guarded in such manner as to furnish complete protection against injury to the Officers of the Post Office and to the contents of the mail bags; and any such packet, if posted, shall be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

8. There shall not be conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, drawing, photograph, lithograph,

engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, supplement, publication, packet, paper, or card having thereon, or on the cover thereof, any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character, and if anything shall be posted which shall *prima facie* fall within the aforesaid prohibition, it shall be stopped and submitted at the General Post Office in London to the inspection of an Officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Postmaster-General.

9. Any postal packet addressed to and received in the United Kingdom which shall be redirected in the United Kingdom to any country or place mentioned in the first column of Part 1 of Schedule No. 1, shall not be liable to or chargeable with any British postage in respect either of such redirection or of the retransmission thereof by post to the country or place to which the same shall be so redirected.

10. On every postal packet posted in any country or place mentioned in the first column of Part 1 of Schedule No. 1, addressed to some part of the same country or place and which shall be redirected in such country or place, and transmitted by post from thence respectively to the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or Tangier, there shall be charged and paid in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus and Tangier, respectively on the delivery thereof, in addition to any postage charged thereon in respect of the inland service of the country or place in which such packet shall have been posted the same rate or rates of postage which such postal packet would have been chargeable with if the same had been originally addressed to the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or Tangier, but in the case of a letter of which the postage to its original address, within such country or place as aforesaid, has been prepaid by means of a postage stamp or stamps valid in the said country or place, affixed to or impressed on such letter the value of such stamp or stamps, shall be deducted from the total amount of postage chargeable under this regulation on such letter as aforesaid.

11. The Postmaster-General may, in any case in which he shall consider it just or reasonable so to do, remit any postage made payable by any regulation contained in this Schedule.

12. In this Warrant and the Schedules thereto, the expression "United Kingdom" means the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man.

Part II.—As to Post Cards.

13. Post cards bearing an impressed stamp shall be issued by the Postmaster-General, for conveyance by post under this Warrant, and the cards so issued, and no others, shall be deemed to be post cards within the meaning of this Warrant.

14. The address and nothing else shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the side of the post card which bears the impressed stamp, and no part of the address shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed across such stamp.

15. Anything (including a letter or communication in the nature of a letter) may be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the side of the post card which does not bear the impressed stamp.

16. Nothing whatever shall be in any manner attached to a post card except a postage stamp or stamps in payment of any deficient postage or additional sum chargeable thereon for registration or for acknowledgment of delivery; nor

shall a post card be cut or folded or otherwise altered.

17. If any post card is posted without the postage chargeable thereon being fully prepaid, or is posted otherwise than in conformity with these regulations, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

Part III.—As to Newspapers.

18. The regulations and conditions made and prescribed by a Treasury Warrant, dated the 27th day of December, 1870, shall in all respects apply to registered newspapers conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post under this Warrant, as mentioned and described in Schedule No. 1.

19. If any newspaper or packet of newspapers be posted in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or Tangier, or at either of the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, or Beyrout respectively, without the postage chargeable thereon being fully prepaid, or be posted otherwise than in conformity with the regulations for the time being in force applicable to its transmission, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

Part IV.—Packets of Commercial Papers.

20. In this Warrant and the Schedules thereto, the expression "Packet of Commercial Papers" shall include all packets consisting of or containing (inter alia) commercial papers, and the expression "Commercial Papers" shall mean and comprise all papers or documents, written or drawn wholly or partly by hand (except letters or communications in the nature of letters or other papers or documents, having the character of an actual and personal correspondence), and shall include all papers and documents of the following kinds, viz:—Papers and documents of legal procedure, deeds drawn up by public functionaries, copies of, or extracts from deeds under private seal (and whether written or printed on stamped or unstamped paper), way bills, bills of lading, invoices, and other documents of a mercantile character, documents of insurance companies and other public companies, all kinds of manuscript music, the manuscripts of books and other literary works, and other papers of similar description.

21. Every packet of commercial papers shall be posted either without a cover (in which case the packet shall be secured by a band) or in an open cover, and in either case so that such band or cover can be easily removed for the purpose of examination.

22. No packet of commercial papers shall be posted which shall contain anything sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or which shall contain any letter or any communication in the nature of a letter or anything of the character of actual and personal correspondence written on any part of the packet or the cover thereof (although the same may be open to inspection).

23. If any packet of commercial papers be posted in the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, Cyprus, or Tangier, or at either of the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout respectively, addressed to any country or place mentioned in the first column of Part 1, of Schedule No. 1, or to the United Kingdom, without any postage being prepaid thereon, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof, but if the postage chargeable thereon be partly prepaid, such packet shall be forwarded to its address charged with double the amount of the deficient postage.

24. If any packet of commercial papers be posted otherwise than in conformity with the

regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 20, 21, and 22, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

Part V.—As to Packets of Printed Papers.

25. In this Warrant and the Schedules thereto, the expression "Packet of Printed Papers" shall include all packets consisting of or containing (inter alia) printed papers, and the expression "Printed Papers" shall mean and comprise all articles of the following kinds, not being commercial papers nor trade patterns, or samples of merchandize, that is to say:—

(1) Printed books, periodicals, literary works, and pamphlets, either stitched or bound, sheets of printed music, visiting cards, address cards, proofs of printing either with or without the manuscripts thereof, circulars, prospectuses, announcements and notices, whether printed, engraved, or lithographed, and notwithstanding that the same may be communications of the nature of a letter, engravings, photographs when not on glass or in frames containing glass, drawings, plans, maps, and catalogues, and in general all impressions or copies upon paper, parchment, or cardboard, obtained by means of printing, lithographing, or any other mechanical process employed for the purpose of printing, except the copying press.

(2) Anything usually attached or appurtenant to any of the before-mentioned articles in the way of binding, mounting, covering, or otherwise, and anything necessary or convenient for their safe transmission by post, which shall be contained in the same packet.

26. Every packet of printed papers shall be posted either without a cover or in an open cover, and so that the same can be easily removed for the purpose of examination.

27. No packet of printed papers shall be sent by post which shall contain anything sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or which shall contain any letter or any communication in the nature of a letter written on any part of the packet or the cover thereof (although the same may be open to inspection), or which shall contain any separate letter or communication in the nature of a letter not being a circular within the meaning of these regulations, but any circular may bear the written signature and address of the sender with his trade or profession and a date.

28. If any packet of printed papers consisting wholly of circulars, notices, and documents of a like kind, be posted otherwise than in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 25, 26, and 27, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

29. If any packet of printed papers (except any packet consisting wholly of circulars, notices, and documents of a like kind) be posted otherwise than in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 25, 26, and 27, it shall be charged and dealt with in all respects as an unpaid letter.

Part VI.—As to Pattern or Sample Packets.

30. In this Warrant and the Schedules thereto, the expression "Pattern or Sample Packet" shall include all packets consisting of or containing (inter alia) such articles as constitute entirely trade patterns or samples of merchandize hereinafter called "Patterns or Samples."

31. No patterns or samples shall be of any intrinsic value, or consist of articles or things of a saleable nature or having a value of their

own apart from their mere use as patterns or samples.

32. Patterns or samples shall, when practicable, be posted in covers open at both ends, and so that the same may be easily removed for the purpose of examination. Nevertheless, samples of seeds, drugs, and other such articles as cannot be posted in open covers, may be posted enclosed in boxes or in bags of linen or other material fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened so as to enable the officers of the Post Office to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

33. There shall be no writing upon any pattern or sample packet, or on the cover thereof, except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the name and the trade or profession of the sender thereof, a manufacturer's or trade mark or number, and the price of the articles of which patterns or samples are contained therein, nor shall there be any writing or other thing enclosed in any such packet, except the name and the trade or profession of the sender thereof, or manufacturer's or trade mark or number, and the price of the articles of which patterns or samples are contained therein, and any such permitted writing in any such packet may be on labels attached to the patterns or samples.

34. If there shall be posted any packet containing a pattern or sample of any intrinsic value, or any article or thing of a saleable nature or having a value of its own apart from its mere use as a pattern or sample, such packet shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

35. If any pattern or sample packet is sent by post otherwise than in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore contained, numbered respectively 32 and 33, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

36. If any pattern or sample packet be posted in Gibraltar, addressed to Spain, the Balearic Islands, the Canary Islands, or the Spanish Possessions on the Northern Coast of Africa, without the postage chargeable thereon being fully prepaid, it shall be detained and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Leverstock Green, in the county of Hertford, and in the diocese of Saint Albans, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of seventy pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the eighteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend; or

any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of one thousand and forty pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of Thornhill Lees, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, and in respect of which we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the same vicarage, and to his successors, a yearly sum of thirty-four pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Thornhill Lees, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one other yearly sum or stipend of thirty-four pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the yearly sum or stipend so payable out of our common fund, as lastly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
