WHEREAS at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, holden at the County Hall, in Mold, in and for the county of Flint, on Wed- instant, and that the first meetings of the High-

sional Order, made at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held at the County Hall, in Mold aforesaid, in and for the said county, on the 1st day of January, 1879, for the formation of certain portions of the said county into Highway Districts, to be called respectively "The Mold Highway District," "The Holywell Highway District," "The St. Asaph Highway District," and "The Hawarden and Hope Highway District," was, so far as respects the Holywell Highway District and the St. Asaph Highway District, confirmed by a Final Order, but with respect to the Mold Highway District [comprising the townships of Arddynwent, Argoed, Bistree, Broncoed, Gwernaffield, Gwysaney, Hartsheath, Hendrebiffa, Leeswood, and Llwynegryn (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Mold). The townships of Cefn, Llysdanhunedd, Llysycoed, Maesygroes, Mechlas, Trelan, and Trellyniau (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Cilcen). The townships of Hendrefigillt, Lygan-y-Lan, and Lygan-y-Wern (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Halkyn). The townships of Cwm, Trefechan, and Trellan (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Nannerch). The townships of Caerfallwch, Golftyn, Kelsterton, Leadbrook Major, Leadbrook Minor, Northop, Soughton, and Wepre (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Northop), and the several townships of Nerquis and Bodidris], the said Provisional Order was varied, by excluding from such district the township of Bodidris, and in like manner with respect to the said Hawarden and Hope Highway District [comprising the townships of Aston, Bannel, Bretton, Broadlane, Broughton, Ewloe Wood, Ewloe Town, Hawarden, Mancott, Manor and Rake, Moor, Pentrobin, Sealand and Shotton (all of which are situate in and form part of the parish of Hawarden).
