THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

BRASTED FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. A representation has been duly made to me by Earl Stanhope, as owner, that a Fair has been annually held on Holy Thursday, in the parish of Brasted, in the county of Kent, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished:

2. On the 27th day of March, 1880, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all the powers enabling us in this behalf do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. Such parts of any Treasury Warrant as relate to the rates and sums now payable for the conveyance by post by land route through France and Italy and the registration of letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets, to and from the countries and places specified in Schedules Nos. 1 and 2, hereunder written, are hereby repealed.

2. The rates of postage and sums for registration to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General, in lieu of the rates and sums now payable in respect of letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to and from the several countries and places by the route and means of conveyance mentioned and described in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2, hereunder written, shall be the rates of postage and sums which are fixed and specified by and in such Schedules respectively.

3. All such letters, newspapers, printed papers, and pattern or sample packets as are hereinbefore referred to in Clause 2 shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions applicable thereto, respectively contained in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2, hereunder written, and in any other Treasury Warrant which may be for the time being in force relating to the countries and places specified in the Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 hereunder written.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1880.
