TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's
Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in
this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the repre-
sentation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General
(testified by his signing the same), and under the
hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order,
direct, and declare as follows:—

1. All Treasury Warrants at any time hereto-
fore made relating to the conveyance by post of
postal packets (which term in this Warrant means
and includes all letters, post cards, newspapers,
packets of commercial papers, packets of printed
papers, and pattern or sample packets) between
the United Kingdom and the West Indian
Colonies of Grenada, St. Lucia, and Tobago (of
the Windward Islands), or between the United
Kingdom and Turks Islands, and also between
any British Colony or Foreign Country and the
West Indian Colonies of Grenada, St. Lucia, and
Tobago (of the Windward Islands), and between
any British Colony or Foreign Country and Turks
Islands, are hereby annulled to the extent to which
such Warrants respectively relate to the several
matters aforesaid.

2. The rates of postage and additional sum for
registration now chargeable and payable by the
authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 29th
day of May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder
written, on postal packets conveyed or delivered
for conveyance by post from or to Jamaica,
to or from any other country or place, and all
regulations and conditions as to the posting,
forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal
packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by
post, now in force and applicable thereto, shall
extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or
delivered for conveyance by post from or to the
West Indian Colonies of Grenada, St. Lucia, and
Tobago (of the Windward Islands), and Turks
Islands, to or from any other country or place in
the same way as if the West Indian Colonies of
Grenada, St. Lucia, and Tobago (of the Wind-
ward Islands), and Turks Islands, had been named
in such before mentioned Warrant of the 29th day
of May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on
the first day of January, 1881.

THE Secretary of State for India in Council
has appointed Mr. James Lyons to superintend
the transfer of Lascars or other persons at the
Port of Newport (Mon.), and to grant the Cer-
tificate required under Section 23 of the Merchant
Shipping Act Amendment Act, 18 and 19 Vic.,
cap. 91.

The fee to be paid for every Lascar or other
person in respect of whom such certificate is ap-
plied for, is limited to three shillings, and, in no
case, is the total amount of fees in respect of one
crew to exceed five pounds.

(No. 220.)—EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO—BANKA
STRAIT.

(1.) *Fixed Red Light on Tanjong Oelar.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice,
that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse on
Tanjong Oelar, west coast of Banka Island:—

The light is a fixed red light of the sixth order,
and should be visible in clear weather in the
northern entrance of Banka Strait from a distance
of 5 miles.
