

*Norfolk*.—So much of the parish of Tasburgh, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Norwich turnpike-road on the north, Hempnall on the east, Stratton St. Michael on the south, and Tasburgh Church on the west.

*Northamptonshire*.—(1.) So much of the parishes of Barby, and Kilsby, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the south the road leading from Kilsby to Hillmorton, on the north the London and North-Western Railway (Old Line), on the east the parish of Kilsby, and on the west the Canal.

(2.) So much of the parishes of Barby, and Kilsby, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the London and North-Western Railway (New Line), on the south the London and North-Western Railway (Old Line), on the east the road leading from Kilsby parish to Kilsby Station, and on the west by the road called Barby Nortofts.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Swine-Fever* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of swine through those Areas, without untrucking):—

*Buckinghamshire*.—So much of the hamlet of Weedon, in the parish of Hardwick, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the east or north-east of the main-road leading from Aylesbury to Buckingham, except the lands, yards, and outbuildings in the said hamlet as are in the occupation of Edward John Clift.

*Wiltshire*.—The petty sessional divisions of Calne, Chippenham, and Malmesbury, in the county of Wilts.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

EDGWARE FAIR.

By Memorial, dated the 16th day of June, 1883, a representation has been duly made to me by the Trustees of the will of the late Richard Heming, Esq., of Hillingdon, near Uxbridge, as owners, that a Fair has been annually held in August at Edgware, in a field No. 305 in the Ordnance Map of the parish of Edgware, in the county of Middlesex, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished:

2. On the 23rd day of July, 1883, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair. *W. V. Harcourt.*

BYE-LAWS AS TO HOUSES LET IN LODGINGS.

WHEREAS application has been made to the Local Government Board by the Local Board of the District of Walker, in the county of Northumberland, being the Urban Sanitary Authority

for the said District, to declare, by notice to be published in the London Gazette, the enactment contained in the 90th section of the Public Health Act, 1875, to be in force within the said District.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, or the schedules thereunder written on reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Norway, to or from the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, and Tangier, and the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, and all regulations and conditions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post now in force and applicable thereto shall extend and apply to all reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Denmark and Iceland, to or from the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, and Tangier, and the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, in the same way as if Denmark and Iceland had been named in the said Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, or the schedules thereunder written.

2. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, or the schedules thereunder written, on reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Bermuda, to or from the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, and Tangier, and the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, and all regulations and conditions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post now in force and applicable thereto shall extend and apply to all reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Danish West Indies, to or from the United Kingdom, Malta, Gibraltar, and Tangier, and the British Post Offices in Constantinople, Smyrna, and Beyrout, respectively, in the same way as if the Danish West Indies had been named in the said Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, or the schedules thereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1883.
