TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

- 1. All Treasury Warrants at any time heretofore made relating to the conveyance by post of
 postal packets (which term in this Warrant means
 and includes all letters, post cards, newspapers,
 packets of commercial papers, packets of printed
 papers, and pattern or sample packets) between
 the United Kingdom and the Republic of Bolivia,
 and also between any British Colony or Foreign
 Country and the Republic of Bolivia, are hereby
 annulled to the extent to which such Warrants
 respectively relate to the several matters comprised
 in this Warrant as aforesaid.
- 2. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written, on postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Salvador, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of such last-mentioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, and all regulations and conditions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post now in force and applicable thereto, shall extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Republic of Bolivia, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of such last-metioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, in the same way as if the Republic of Bolivia, had been named in such lastmentioned Warrant of the 29th day on May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Consolidated Order. Outdoor Labour Test:—

Cookham Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Cookham
Union, in the county of Berks;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Cookham Union, as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:—

following manner; that is to say:—
Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles

of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3.—If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of such an officer.
