#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of certain Treasury Warrants made in that behalf, dated respectively the 22nd day of August, 1885, the 1st day of December, 1885, and the 24th day of February, 1886, Parcels not exceeding seven pounds in weight may, subject to the provisions of such Warrants respectively, be transmitted by Post from and to the United Kingdom and the following places, namely, the Straits Settlements, Hong Kong, the Leeward Islands, and Barbados, respectively.

And whereas arrangements have been made under which Parcels exceeding seven pounds, and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, may be transmitted from and to the United Kingdom and the several places hereinbefore mentioned, and it is expedient to fix the rates of postage to be payable in respect thereof, and to make such other provision as is hereinafter contained.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to

Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare, as follows:—

1. There shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled, on and as from the day upon which this Warrant comes into operation,

(1.) So much of the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to as provides that no Parcel which exceeds in weight seven pounds shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post, under the provisions of the said Warrants between the United Kingdom and the places hereinbefore respectively mentioned, or as otherwise limits the weight of Parcels conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post, under the provisions of the said Warrants, between the United Kingdom and such places respectively; and also

(2.) So much of the said several Warrants as fixes the rates of postage payable on Parcels transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and the several places hereinbefore mentioned.

2. On and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation any Parcel exceeding seven pounds but not exceeding eleven pounds in weight may be conveyed or transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and the respective places hereinbefore mentioned, under the provisions of the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to as amended by this Warrant,

but no Parcel exceeding eleven pounds in weight shall be so conveyed or transmitted.

3. On and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation there shall be charged and paid on all Parcels transmitted by Post between the several places mentioned in the Schedule hereto under the provisions of the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to as amended by this Warrant the rates of postage specified in such Schedule.

4. The rates of postage fixed by this Warrant, on Parcels transmitted by the Post as herein respectively mentioned, shall be deemed to be mentioned or referred to in lieu of the rates fixed by the several Warrants hereinbefore mentioned wherever in the said Warrants the last mentioned rates of postage are mentioned or referred to.

5. This Warrant shall be read as one with the several Warrants hereinbefore mentioned, and terms to which a meaning is prescribed in the said Warrants, shall have the same meaning when used in this Warrant.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

##### *Definitions.*

1. In this Warrant:—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

##### *Places between which Parcels may be Transmitted.*

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and Heligoland.

##### *Rates of Postage.*

3. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant between the United Kingdom and Heligoland there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage (that is to say):—

If such Parcels are sent by way of Hamburg:—  
On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, one shilling and five pence.

On every Parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, one shilling and eleven pence.

If such Parcels are sent by way of Belgium:—  
On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, one shilling and eight pence halfpenny.
