NORTH BORNEO AND THE UNITED KINGDOM, &c.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. All Treasury Warrants at any time heretofore made relating to the conveyance by post of postal packets (which term in this Warrant means and includes all letters, postcards, reply postcards, newspapers, packets of commercial papers, packets of printed papers, and pattern or sample packets) between the United Kingdom and the State of North Borneo, and also between any British colony or foreign country and the State of North Borneo, are hereby annulled to the extent to which such Warrants respectively relate to the several matters comprised in this Warrant as aforesaid.

2. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrants of the 14th day of January, 1880, the 15th day of June, 1880, and the 9th day of March, 1886 (the last-mentioned Warrant relating to reply postcards), or the schedules thereunder, respectively written

on postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Straits Settlements to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants, or any of them, and all regulations and conditions now in force as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post between the Straits Settlements and any other country or place as aforesaid, shall extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the State of North Borneo to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants, in the same way as if the State of North Borneo had been named or referred to in the said Warrants and the schedules thereunder written, in the same manner as the Straits Settlements are named or referred to therein.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:
Altering General Consolidated Order: Minutes
of Proceedings of Guardians:—

Croydon Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Croydon Union, in the County Borough of Croydon and the Counties of Surrey and London;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Croydon Union, amongst others, the Poor Law Commissioners prescribed Rules and Regulations as to the Meetings and Proceedings of the said Guardians, and by Article 41 (Firstly), of the said Order provision is made with regard to the reading of Minutes of the proceedings at the Meetings of the said Guardians; and it is expedient that, so far as regards the said Croydon Union, further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby, so far as regards the said Croydon Union, alter the said Order, and Direct as follows:—

If the said Guardians shall so direct, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to the Guardians to prepare for printing a copy of the Minutes of each ordinary or other Meeting of the Guardians, and to send to each Guardian, by post or otherwise, forty-eight hours at least before each ordinary Meeting of the Guardians, a printed copy of the Minutes of the last ordinary Meeting and of every other Meeting of the Guardians held since the last ordinary Meeting; and if, in pursuance of any such direction, a printed copy of such Minutes shall have been so sent to each Guardian it shall not be necessary that the Minutes so sent shall be read at the next ordinary Meeting if at such Meeting the Guardians resolve that such Minutes be taken as read. Any such Resolution shall be entered upon the Minutes in lieu of an

entry to the effect that the Minutes have been read.
