ORDER of the Local Government Board :
Altering Name of Union :—

Ulverston (Ulverstone) Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Ulverstone
Union, in the county of Lancaster ;

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the
Poor of the several Parishes and Places com-
prised in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 13 of "The Divided
Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876,"
it is enacted as follows :—

"The Local Government Board may, when
"they see fit, by their Order change the
"name of any Union, and direct how such
"change of name shall be published ; no
"such change of name shall affect any rights
"or obligations of, or securities given by or
"to, the said Union, or render defective any
"legal proceedings instituted by or against
"the said Union ; and any legal proceedings
"may be continued or commenced by or
"against the said Union by their new name
"which might have been continued or com-
"menced by or against the Union by their
"former name."

And whereas by an Order dated the 2nd day
of August, 1836, the Poor Law Commissioners
declared that the several Parishes and Places
specified in the margin thereof should be united
for the administration of the laws for the relief
of the Poor, and the said Union has been known
by the name of the Ulverstone Union ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 31st day
of August, 1858, the Poor Law Board directed
that the Parish of Angerton should be added to
the said Union ;

And whereas it is expedient that the name of
the said Union should be changed as hereinafter-
mentioned :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government
Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by
the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as
follows :—

ARTICLE I.—On and after the twenty-sixth
day of March, one thousand eight hundred and
ninety-one, the name of the said Union shall
be changed to the Ulverston Union, and the
Guardians of the Poor thereof shall be termed
"The Guardians of the Poor of the Ulverston
Union."

ARTICLE II.—The said Guardians shall cause
this Order to be published for two successive
weeks, within one month from the date hereof, in
some newspaper circulating within the Union.

CANADA AND BARBADOS:

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's
Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to
Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all
powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this
Warrant, made on the representation of Her
Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his
signing the same), and under the hands of two of
us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and
declare as follows :—

Definition.

1. In this Warrant and the schedule thereto
the expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet
which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the
provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant
amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant
comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the
provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post
between the Dominion of Canada and Barbados.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all parcels transmitted by post under
this Warrant there shall be charged and paid the
several rates of postage specified in the schedule
hereto.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

4. No parcel which shall exceed two feet in
length or one foot in width or depth, or which
shall exceed five pounds in weight, shall be con-
veyed or tendered for conveyance under this
Warrant.

Provisions of other Warrants to apply.

5. Every such Parcel shall be posted, for-
warded, conveyed, and delivered under and
subject to all such regulations, conditions, and
restrictions, as the Post Office authorities in
Canada and Barbados respectively, with the
approval of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General,
may from time to time prescribe.

Commencement of Warrant.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation
on the first day of April, one thousand eight
hundred and ninety-one.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 16th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 51 and 52 Vic., cap. 32, to the amount of £1,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 21st February, 1891, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date, at the option of the persons tendering, viz. :—on the 21st May or 21st August next, or 21st February, 1892, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 17th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than one o'clock, on Saturday, the 21st instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
